

Freedom to Love

“For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’”

Galatians 5: 13-15

Recently I have heard some painful news about our world. In the African nation of Sudan there has been a humanitarian crisis taking place. Because of a war 15,000 – 30,000 have been killed with close to 2 million refugees, whose homes have been literally destroyed. On the other hand, I was also encouraged to see our Secretary of State, Colin Powell, take strong compassionate leadership and encourage the world community to help with this imminent crisis.

As followers of Jesus, we cannot help but be touched by the pictures of suffering men, women and children. For most of us it is hard to imagine what it must be like to be in the middle of a war, to lose your home and belongings, or to become a refugee. We in the United States have been blessed with an incredible freedom that allows us to choose much of what we do. How do we each use this amazing gift that God has given us and many in our nation have defended? Paul tells us that we are to use this freedom, not as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but as an opportunity to become slaves to one another, to love one another. He finally sums up this passage by emphasizing that the *whole law*

can be summed up in, “*love you neighbor as yourself.*”

Our Redeemer’s is a wonderful place for us to be family and to know the freedom to worship, learn, fellowship together and serve as we are each called. Paul poses the question of freedom, not just to the Galatians, but to us as well. How do we use our freedom as followers of Jesus our Lord and Savior? It is my prayer that as we move into the fall of 2004 we might continue to grow in our effectiveness and potential for Christian ministry. It is so important for us that we commit ourselves to witness and mission so that we might be a place where; 1) *the hurt and the broken find healing*; 2) *the lost find their way to a grace filled life and*; 3) *the needy have the good news of Christ offered to them in word and in deed*. In this way we might all grow in our journey to become *fully devoted disciples of Jesus Christ*. As we do that the resurrected Christ might continue to become a living reality for those in our local community as well as for those who are in need in the Sudan and other parts of our broken world.



Wayne, Kathy, and Jason want to thank all of you who said prayers for him. Jason is sure there were several times that the Lord pulled him out of harm's way.


